The stylised WAGEINDICATOR websurvey

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1. Introduction

The *WageIndicator* is an international, continuous web-based project. A national *WageIndicator* website has content about wages, working conditions, labor standards or other work-related topics. It has a crowd-pulling *Salary Check* providing free information on occupation-specific wages, controlled for individual factors. In all countries, an apparent need for wage information can be seen. After having explored the pages with wage information, web-visitors are encouraged to complete the continuous, international comparable questionnaire on work and wages with a prize incentive.

This paper and its Appendix presents the stylized *WageIndicator* webquestionnaire, as it is at the end of 2006. For updates and detailed information, see www.wageindicator.org/. The section Research Lab has downloadable information related to the survey, covering topics such as the codebook, introductions to the dataset, explorations of the bias in the dataset, etceteras.

2. The questionnaire: target population

The target population of the *WageIndicator* questionnaire is the labor force, i.e. individuals in paid employment and job seekers. Apart from workers in formal dependent employment it aims to include apprentices, employers, own-account workers, freelancers, workers in family businesses, workers in the informal sector, unemployed workers, individuals who never had a job, job seekers, and retired workers, housewives, school pupils or students with a job on the side. The respondent's employment status is determined in the first survey question: "Which description matches best your current employment activity?". The employment statuses are clustered into groups, each having a unique routing through the questionnaire. The appendix shows the routing in the row RELEVANT.

Multiple jobholders are identified, and so are the working hours and employment status in their second job. The remaining questions address the main job only.

Workers in the informal labor market are identified by questions, asking if the respondent has a signed work card, receives payment in cash, is paid in kind, and is paying taxes. In India, for example, a few additional questions ask who provides for the equipment the worker uses to perform the job.

3. The questionnaire: topics on work and wages

The WageIndicator questionnaire aims to collect information on wages and working conditions of employed people and job seekers in the target countries. Among others, it asks in detail for wages, fringe benefits and wage perceptions. The questionnaire has some 100 questions and is divided into six sections, as the Table shows. Each section ends with attitudes and opinions regarding the issues addressed.

Table 1. The six sections of the WageIndicator questionnaire

- A YOUR OCCUPATION employment status, education, industry, occupation, training
- B YOUR PLACE OF WORK firm characteristics, branch and firm size, percentage female, MNE, workplace characteristics, departmental staffing levels, cooperation, collective bargaining coverage, IT-use at the workplace, attitudes towards IT-adaptation
- C YOUR EMPLOYMENT HISTORY employment record, years of experience total, with current employer and in current job, career break, job search
- D YOUR WORKING HOURS working hours, overtime, timing of work, shift work, working time preferences
- E YOUR EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT AND SALARY employment contract, wages, payment period, fringe benefits, bonuses, and wage perceptions
- F PERSONAL QUESTIONS age, gender, ethnic background, country of birth, region, household composition, marital status, children's age, division of household chores, job and life satisfaction

4. Understanding the stylized questionnaire

The worldwide *WageIndicator* web-survey is managed in the Netherlands. The survey has a sound web-based, multi-country, multi-lingual Questionnaire Management System (QMS). It consists of a Master file and language versions. Belgium has two questionnaires, one in Dutch, one in French, and the questionnaire in the Netherlands is different from the Belgium Dutch questionnaire.

To some extent the questionnaire allows for country-specific questions. In addition, some countries employ a long and a short version of the questionnaire, the latter asking the obligatory questions only. This is particularly applies to countries with slow telecommunication lines and to cases where online media partners have built in the questionnaire in their own websites. The questions that provide information for calculating hourly wages and non-wage variables needed for the *Salary Check* on the national *WageIndicator* websites are obligatory. In addition, some questions are obligatory because they are critical to the routing. Finally, some questions are obligatory because they are needed for specified research objectives.

Drop out during completion of the quesitonniare is a serious problem for web-surveys. One solution is to prevent that any target group drops out, because they do not feel addressed properly in the questionnaire. In the *WageIndicator* web-survey therefore, many questions have parallel questions. For example, some questions are asked in the past tense for the unemployed and in the present tense for the employed. School pupils have a different parallel question when it comes to marital status. Trainees have different questions about traineeships than persons who are not a trainee. Apart from the target groups, parallel questions are asked for different subgroups. For example, persons with one child get the question What year is your child born", whereas persons with two or more children are asked "What year are your

children born?". Persons in dependent employment are asked for their last wage, whereas self-employed are asked for their anual income. This stylized questionnaire in the Appendix does not show the parallel questions for reasons of readability. In addition, the questions used in one country or a few countries are not shown.

The stylized questionnaire has two columns. The second one shows the questions, answers and related information; the first column uses the following words.

- The row HINT includes the instruction to a question.
- The row RELEVANT shows the relevance rules applicable to a question, thus indicating the routing through the questionnaire.
- The row REQUIRED indicates that a question is obligatory.
- The row VALUE indicates that the numerical value of the answer, used in the statistical dataset.
- The row RANGE frames the answer into a range of values, for example year of birth must be between 1930 and 1996.
- The row CONSTRAINT prevents conflicting answers, e.g. the year of re-entering the labor market after a break must be larger than the year leaving the labor market.
- The row SEARCH TREE indicates that a two or three tier search tree is used to elicit the answer to the question, for example about occupation.
- The row ALERT reflects the text shown when the respondent ticks an impossible answer, f.e. "Is your net wage larger than your gross wage?".
- The row TYPE reflects that the answer consists of a text area.
- The row DATATYPE reflects that the answer consists of an amount.
- The row TEXT includes the introduction to the questionnaire.

In the stylized questionnaire five colors are used.

- The color RED indicates the six sections, as explained in Table 1.
- The color BLUE presents the questions, and each question has its variable label in the first column.
- The color GREEN presents the answers to the questions, and each answer has its value label in the first column.
- The color ORANGE reflects the frame of a set of questions, clustered on one screen.
- The color WHITE holds the relevant rules, the hints, the alerts, the data types, the constraints, and the obligatory questions.
